<b>CASK BEERS</b>			
<b>Abbeydale</b> <i>Sheffield, South Yorkshire</i>	<b>Black Mass (GF)</b> <i>IPA (Black)</i>	<b>6.66</b>	One of the world's long-standing Black IPA's. Brewed using 6 different malts and generously hopped with Cascade and Green Bullet. Flavours reminiscent of bitter chocolate, fruitcake and raisins, with beautiful aromas of dark chocolate, coffee and burnt toast. A beast of a brew!
<b>Ainsty</b> <i>York, North Yorkshire</i>	<b>Flummoxed Farmer</b> <i>Blonde</i>	<b>4</b>	A sessionable light Blonde Ale with an abundance of American hops giving a refreshing and slightly hoppy dry finish and subtle fruit aromas.
<b>Allendale</b> <i>Hexham, Northumberland</i>	<b>Force Majeure</b> <i>Pale Ale</i>	<b>4.1</b>	A Vienna Pale Ale. Golden in colour giving a nice malty hoppy balance and a mild bitter finish.
<b>Anarchy</b> <i>Newcastle, Tyne &amp; Wear</i>	<b>Prison Dog</b> <i>Pale Ale</i>	<b>4.2</b>	Fruity and tropical Pale Ale with New Zealand hops.
<b>Avid</b> <i>Quernmore, Lancashire</i>	<b>Tsarina Yekaterina</b> <i>Russian Imperial Stout</i>	<b>9</b>	A different iteration is brewed every year especially for our festival. A rich indulgent stout, aged for 2 years in oak barrels. Full of rich treacle and vanilla aromas, defined roasted malt flavours and rich sweetness with just a slight sharpness at the end, which lightens the drink and masks its strength.
<b>Beer Shack</b> <i>Clitheroe, Lancashire</i>	<b>Alan &amp; Brian's Volunteer ESB</b> <i>ESB</i>	<b>5.5</b>	A traditional full bodied Extra Special Bitter. Well balanced due to the classic combination of English hops and Heritage Chevalier malt.
<b>Big Trip/Beer Shack</b> <i>Manchester, Gtr Manchester/Clitheroe, Lancashire</i>	<b>Munchkin Conspiracy Theory</b> <i>Mountain IPA</i>	<b>4.3</b>	A compromise between West Coast and New England styles. This IPA has both bitterness and haze, as well as fruity hop aromas and juiciness from the Harlequin, Apollo and Cryo Mosaic hops.
<b>Bowland</b> <i>Clitheroe, Lancashire</i>	<b>Grasping at Straws</b> <i>Berliner Weiss</i>	<b>3.5</b>	A refreshingly tart raspberry and strawberry Berliner Weiss. Crisp, dry and fruity.
<b>Bowland</b> <i>Clitheroe, Lancashire</i>	<b>Spirit of Bowland</b> <i>Best Bitter</i>	<b>4.2</b>	Named after their race horse Spirit of Bowland, this racy bay best bitter is sure to be a winner!
<b>Bowland</b> <i>Clitheroe, Lancashire</i>	<b>Black Beauty</b> <i>Imperial Stout</i>	<b>9</b>	Black in colour, this is a rich full-bodied stout from the combination of roasted barley and other dark malts, giving hints of liquorice, chocolate and molasses.
<b>Brass Castle</b> <i>Malton, North Yorkshire</i>	<b>Sweet Spot (GF)</b> <i>Light Mild</i>	<b>5.5</b>	Originated as a collaboration with North Riding Brewery. It lets the fun shine through in the form of a light mild infused with Fruit Salad sweets.
<b>Brass Castle</b> <i>Malton, North Yorkshire</i>	<b>Five Card Draw (GF)</b> <i>IPA</i>	<b>5</b>	This American style classic showcases five of the best hops. With Cascade and Mosaic in the boil and El Dorado, Summit and Bru-1 dry hopped on top, expect grapefruit, pine and citrus notes with a gentle hint of pineapple and stone fruit.
<b>Brid's Cross</b> <i>Rochdale, Gtr Manchester</i>	<b>Andraste's Hare</b> <i>Golden</i>	<b>3.8</b>	Golden Ale with a biscuity malt base and a tantalising hint of fruity apricot. A wonderful light crisp ale. Perfect vibes for spring and summer.
<b>Brid's Cross</b> <i>Rochdale, Gtr Manchester</i>	<b>Under the Eildon Tree</b> <i>IPA</i>	<b>5.7</b>	Slight caramel malt flavoured West Coat IPA reminiscent of an old school IPA. The hops bring a blend of grapefruit and orange, with hints of peach and apricot in the background.

<b>Burning Sky</b> <i>Firle, East Sussex</i>	<b>Plateau</b> <i>Pale Ale</i>	<b>3.5</b>	Gold in colour, with a crisp malt edge and sharp bitterness. Hopped at different stages of the brew with a big mix of US and NZ hops. Full in flavour, zesty, refreshing & low in alcohol.
<b>Cloudwater</b> <i>Manchester, Gtr Manchester</i>	<b>Piccadilly Gold</b> <i>Golden</i>	<b>4</b>	A straw-coloured Golden Ale featuring bright Citra hops that are pleasantly balanced with a delicate malt base. Supremely quenchable, it's equal parts refreshing and flavourful.
<b>Colbier</b> <i>Bootle, Merseyside</i>	<b>Baritone</b> <i>Best Bitter</i>	<b>4.3</b>	This Best Bitter is inspired by British brewing traditions. This cask-conditioned beer uses East Kent Goldings hops to add a touch of spice and honey notes to complement the rich caramel flavour coming from a blend of five different malts.
<b>Darwin (Three Kings)</b> <i>Sunderland, Tyne and Wear</i>	<b>Evolution</b> <i>Bitter</i>	<b>4</b>	A classic copper coloured malty bitter. Gently hopped with Fuggles and Cascade to complement a grain bill which includes Crystal and Amber malts.
<b>Disruption is Brewing</b> <i>Camberley, Surrey</i>	<b>Memoirs of a Geezer</b> <i>Bitter</i>	<b>4.2</b>	A Bitter, but not as you know it. Fruity sweetness and red berry flavours from new age hops such as HBC-630 lead to a modern take on a Bitter.
<b>Docks</b> <i>Grimsby, Lincolnshire</i>	<b>Labour of Love</b> <i>Blonde</i>	<b>3.4</b>	A traditional British Blonde Ale updated using a massive dry hop of Citra and Amarillo, giving big cloudy lemonade flavours with added punch from Centennial hops.
<b>Elusive</b> <i>Finchampstead, Berkshire</i>	<b>Oregon Trail</b> <i>IPA</i>	<b>5.8</b>	Oregon Trail is regarded as the best classically-styled West Coast IPA brewed in the UK. Simcoe, Chinook and Columbus hops combine to deliver a resinous profile with a citrus undertone. The bitterness helps to balance the light caramel flavours of the malts.
<b>Facers</b> <i>Flint, Flintshire</i>	<b>Clwyd Gold</b> <i>Red</i>	<b>3.5</b>	Brewed for those who like a traditional British style of beer, with a rich ruby colour and plenty of malty roasted flavour.
<b>Fauna</b> <i>Arundel, West Sussex</i>	<b>Meadow Maker</b> <i>Golden</i>	<b>4.6</b>	An English Golden Ale that uses both traditional and modern English hops. The flavour profile is lightly sweet and malty with a hint of tangerine and low to medium hop bitterness with a light aroma.
<b>Four Mice</b> <i>Bolton by Bowland, Lancashire</i>	<b>Tremaine</b> <i>Golden</i>	<b>4.1</b>	Refreshing Golden/Amber Ale, brewed at the Coach & Horses Inn, Bolton by Bowland, giving subtle bread notes from the malt with flavours of citrus and mango shining through from the Citra hops.
<b>Goffs</b> <i>Cheltenham, Gloucestershire</i>	<b>White Knight</b> <i>IPA</i>	<b>4.7</b>	A well-hopped English IPA using Pilgrim, Fuggles and East Kent Goldings for a gentle bitterness and a dry hoppy finish. Deceptively drinkable for its strength.
<b>Indie Rabble</b> <i>Windsor, Berkshire</i>	<b>Here you go John!</b> <i>Mild</i>	<b>3</b>	Winners of SIBA's best new Independent Craft Brewery 2024 award. This has dark chocolate and roasty notes with a smooth velvety body, subtle toasty bitterness and dark red fruit for the perfect springtime pint.
<b>Kernel</b> <i>Bermondsey, London</i>	<b>Dry Stout (Motueka El Dorado)</b> <i>Stout</i>	<b>4.8</b>	A dry stout brewed with an ever-changing variety of hops. This version is with Motueka and El Dorado. A highly drinkable dry and bitter Irish Stout with notes of coffee, chocolate and roasted malts offset against delicate hop aromas.
<b>Lancaster</b> <i>Lancaster, Lancashire</i>	<b>Emperor IPA</b> <i>IPA</i>	<b>4.4</b>	Refreshing fruity extra pale IPA with hints of orange and lemon.
<b>Lune Brew</b> <i>Lancaster, Lancashire</i>	<b>Blackberry Pale</b> <i>Pale Ale</i>	<b>4</b>	Part of their limited-edition range. This Pale Ale is fresh and fruity with a subtle blackberry tart twist. Scarlett red in colour, fruity in flavour.
<b>Lymestone</b> <i>Stone, Staffordshire</i>	<b>Ein Stein</b> <i>Pale Ale</i>	<b>5</b>	Very pale and packed with German hops to give a well-balanced beer similar in flavour to many quality continental beers.

<b>Marble</b> <i>Salford, Gtr Manchester</i>	<b>Liberation Frequency</b> <i>Pale Ale (GF)</i>	<b>4</b>	Marble's very first gluten free beer. An easy drinking Pale Ale crafted with Ekuanot, Mosaic and Azacca hops that is bursting with flavour.
<b>Moonwake</b> <i>Leith, Edinburgh</i>	<b>Golden Promise</b> <i>Pale Ale</i>	<b>4.4</b>	This Pale Ale is crafted with the famed Golden Promise malt, renowned for imparting a rich malt essence and a delightful mouthfeel to the beer. The malt harmoniously balances the hop character from Azacca and Sultana hops, which infuse the beer with honey and orange notes.
<b>Moorhouses/Beer Shack</b> <i>Burnley/Clitheroe, Lancashire</i>	<b>Shack it Up</b> <i>American Brown Ale</i>	<b>4.5</b>	A strong malt backbone. The hints of chocolate, caramel and toast are balanced by the use of Chinook, Centennial and Mount Hood American hops to add more bitterness and fruit flavours.
<b>Neon Raptor</b> <i>Nottingham, Nottinghamshire</i>	<b>Joystick</b> <i>Golden</i>	<b>3.8</b>	A tantalising combination of the traditional and modern. It's a straw coloured clean and easily sipped pint of spring joy, with a blend of UK and US hops bringing notes of kiwi, ripe melon, and fruit tea.
<b>Neptune/Brew York</b> <i>Liverpool, Merseyside &amp; York, North Yorkshire</i>	<b>Water Lanes</b> <i>Wheat</i>	<b>4.1</b>	A delicious American Wheat with citrus fruit flavours balanced by a light malt breadiness with a hop bitterness
<b>Northern Alchemy</b> <i>Newcastle, Tyne &amp; Wear</i>	<b>John Barleycorn</b> <i>Mild</i>	<b>4.8</b>	Mild ale based on a 1920s style.
<b>Patron's Tap</b> <i>Blackburn, Lancashire</i>	<b>Heir of the Dog</b> <i>Blonde</i>	<b>4.3</b>	The first Blonde Ale from a new local microbrewery. Very sessionable straw coloured ale with a light citrus backdrop. Hopped with Centennial and Cascade hops, then finally dry hopped with Chinook .
<b>Pennine</b> <i>Bedale, North Yorkshire</i>	<b>Heartland</b> <i>Amber</i>	<b>3.9</b>	Dark copper coloured ale with a toffee, malted caramel smell and a rich smooth moreish flavour.
<b>Roosters</b> <i>Harrogate, North Yorkshire</i>	<b>Maypole</b> <i>Pale Ale</i>	<b>3.7</b>	A seasonal Pale Ale brewed using Cascade hops and infused with elderflowers to produce a delicate floral and citrus aroma.
<b>Serious</b> <i>Rochdale, Gtr Manchester</i>	<b>Goldrush</b> <i>Pale Ale</i>	<b>5.6</b>	Golden coloured and brewed with Abbaye yeast and delicately flavoured British hops. A classic tasting Belgian style Pale Ale offering hints of banana and a fruity malty taste.
<b>Simple Things Fermentations</b> <i>Muirend, Glasgow</i>	<b>Best Bitter</b> <i>Bitter</i>	<b>4.5</b>	Copper coloured, smooth, well balanced with moderate bitterness and a crisp dry finish. The Maris Otter and Aromatic malts provide the perfect base for earthy floral East Kent Goldings hops to shine. A touch of spice on the nose is underpinned with honey, toast and biscuit.
<b>Spitting Feathers</b> <i>Chester, Cheshire</i>	<b>Brainstorm (GF)</b> <i>Pale Ale</i>	<b>4</b>	A refreshingly dry, zesty and hoppy Pale Ale.
<b>Spring Hill</b> <i>Belthorn, Lancashire</i>	<b>Top Grafter</b> <i>Pale Ale</i>	<b>3.5</b>	A refreshing and fruity Pale Ale from a brand new local brewery.
<b>Thirsty Moose</b> <i>Newcastle, Tyne &amp; Wear</i>	<b>Canny Canuck</b> <i>Brown Ale</i>	<b>4.5</b>	A combination of a Canadian staple and the North East's most beloved beer style. This modern take on a North East classic has deep malty flavours of biscuit, nuts, caramel, hints of chocolate and fermented maple syrup. This creates a smoky woodland aroma.
<b>Thwaites</b> <i>Mellor Brook, Lancashire</i>	<b>Gold</b> <i>Golden</i>	<b>4.1</b>	Maris Otter malt and Slovenian and Bavarian hops create an initial sweetness followed by a refreshing citrus hop character.
<b>Thwaites</b> <i>Mellor Brook, Lancashire</i>	<b>English Old Ale</b> <i>Old Ale</i>	<b>5</b>	Rich, full fruit and sweet malt, balanced with moderate bitterness and a warming finish.
<b>Trig</b> <i>York, North Yorkshire</i>	<b>Interloper</b> <i>Porter</i>	<b>5</b>	A mixture of biscuit, caramel and roasted malts builds a dark complex body that leads to smoked coffee and chocolate flavours.

<b>Trig</b> <i>York, North Yorkshire</i>	<b>Sgurr</b> <i>Pale Ale</i>	4.3	Hop forward and silky. Simcoe and Necteron hops are layered on an oat filled malt base, leading to a fruity and easy drinking ale.
<b>Turning Point</b> <i>Knaresborough, North Yorkshire</i>	<b>Lucid Dream</b> <i>Milk Stout</i>	5	Heaps of different malts and oats give a sumptuous, smooth mouthfeel and body. Sweet, creamy and delicious, with subtle dessert flavours.
<b>Turning Point</b> <i>Knaresborough, North Yorkshire</i>	<b>Hexagon Architect</b> <i>Braggot</i>	5	A honey and Rhubarb Pale Ale...that's actually a Braggot, a beer/mead hybrid. It uses wildflower honey from Hive Mead and Brew...with an added Yorkshire influence of rhubarb!
<b>Twice Brewed</b> <i>Hexham, Northumberland</i>	<b>Sycamore Gap</b> <i>Pale Ale</i>	4.1	Light and refreshing Pale Ale with punchy citrus-hop flavour from Cascade and masses of Lemondrop hops. In memory of THE famous tree.
<b>Unbarred</b> <i>Brighton, East Sussex</i>	<b>Pale Ale : Chinook and Mosaic</b> <i>Pale Ale</i>	4.8	A modern style Pale Ale. Chinook and Mosaic hops give a bright citrus aroma with light spice and pine notes.
<b>Utopian</b> <i>Crediton, Devon</i>	<b>Red Ale</b> <i>Red Ale</i>	4.4	An American-style Red Ale using dark Crystal malts, Maris Otter pale malts and a small addition of black treacle. Generously hopped with Mystic, including a dry hop to add layers of fruit and citrus and balance the malt sweetness.
<b>Woodforde's</b> <i>Woodbastwick, Norfolk</i>	<b>Phoenix IPA</b> <i>IPA</i>	4.2	Originally Phoenix XXX. It's a Norfolk ale filled with rich flavour from the Maris Otter, English Challenger, Goldings and American Amarillo hops.

<b>KEG BEERS</b> <i>(k = Keg, KK = Keykeg)</i>			
<b>Braybrooke</b> <i>Market Harborough, Leicestershire</i>	<b>Keller Lager (K)</b> <i>Lager</i>	4.8	Kellerbier, meaning cellar beer, is a style that originates in Franconia. It's made using high quality German malts, Tettnanger hops and fresh Bavarian lager yeast. It's full bodied with a distinctive smooth mouthfeel. Delicious and refreshing.
<b>Braybrooke</b> <i>Market Harborough, Leicestershire</i>	<b>Radiator Doppelbock (K)</b> <i>Doppelbock</i>	7.5	This is a bigger and stronger version of the German Bock beer style. A smooth dark brown rich lager with gentle notes of caramel and dark chocolate, giving flavours of toasted bread and dark fruit.
<b>Duration</b> <i>West Acre, Norfolk</i>	<b>Good Times American Light Lager (KK)</b> <i>Lager</i>	4.2	Crisp and sweet, this refreshingly light lager uses corn for a malty sweetness and aroma, pouring clear and bright with minimal bitterness.
<b>Great Beyond</b> <i>Hoxton, London</i>	<b>Hoxton White (K)</b> <i>Wheat</i>	4.2	A light crisp Wheat Beer with a vibrant citrus finish. A Belgian classic given an East London makeover. Flavours of orange and pink grapefruit zest, coriander seeds, elderflower and pink peppercorns.
<b>Lakes</b> <i>Kendal, Cumbria</i>	<b>Where Mangoes Fear to Tread (K)</b> <i>Gose</i>	5.5	Gose is a traditional German style unfiltered sour wheat beer. This one is flavoured with smooth mango, punchy pineapple and sultry lime with a dash of salt!
<b>Kernel</b> <i>Bermondsey, London</i>	<b>Biere de Saison (KK)</b> <i>Saison</i>	4.7	Fermented with Kernel's own house mixed culture of yeast, wild yeast and bacteria. Aged in old wine barrels for 8-9 months and refermented with apricots. Dry, tart and refreshing.
<b>Phantom</b> <i>Reading, Berkshire</i>	<b>Nine (KK)</b> <i>Pilsner</i>	4.6	An easy drinking West Coast take on a Pilsner light Lager, featuring Amarillo, Citra and Idaho 7 hops with notes of orange, fresh pine and tropical fruit.
<b>Pollys</b> <i>Mold, Flintshire</i>	<b>Dark Demo (KK)</b> <i>Sour</i>	4.5	Black cherry, blackcurrant and blackberry that is equal parts sweet, sour and a little bit savoury.
<b>Rivington</b> <i>Rivington, Lancashire</i>	<b>Double Fog (KK)</b> <i>DIPA</i>	8	A Double IPA version of their famous Never Known Fog Like It. An amped-up, fruity, dank and massively hopped tropical juice bomb.

<b>Sierra Nevada</b> <i>California, USA</i>	<b>Pale Ale (K)</b> <i>Pale Ale</i>	5	The legendary beer that started the US craft beer revolution, which then spread to the UK. It has a deep amber color and an exceptionally full-bodied complex character, using premium Cascade hops to give it its fragrant bouquet and spicy flavour.
<b>Thwaites</b> <i>Mellor Brook, Lancashire</i>	<b>Paradise No 3 (K)</b> <i>Pale Ale</i>	4.1	A totally tropical Pale Ale, with mango and pineapple ensuring a refreshing burst of flavour. Golden in colour and bittersweet in taste. Brewed using Citra, Ernest and Styrian Cardinal hops.
<b>Vault City</b> <i>Edinburgh, Scotland</i>	<b>Rhubarb, Blackberry Swirl Donut (KK)</b> <i>Sour</i>	4.3	If you go nuts for doughnuts, then we have the perfect dessert sour for you. A double serving of tangy fruit flavours, jam-packed with rhubarb and blackberries, topped off with a sweet swirl of smooth creamy vanilla.
<b>Woodforde's</b> <i>Woodbastwick, Norfolk</i>	<b>Volt (K)</b> <i>IPA</i>	4.5	Pale gold in colour with a tropical citrus taste and floral pine aromas from the hop mix of Cascade, Amarillo and Admiral. Further boosted by a mix of Citra, Bravo, Centennial and Simcoe T90's hops.
<b>Yonder</b> <i>Radstock, Somerset</i>	<b>Honeycomb Double Berry Ripple (KK)</b> <i>Sour</i>	6.5	Close your eyes, imagine strawberry and raspberry ice-cream folded together and sprinkled with delicious honeycomb. Now drink this lovely sour.
<b>Yonder</b> <i>Radstock, Somerset</i>	<b>Basque Cheesecake Pastry Stout (KK)</b> <i>Pastry Stout</i>	8.4	This Basque-style cheesecake Pastry Stout tastes big, thick, sweet and burnt black! Brewed with complex dark malts for flavours of over-caramelised sugar and plenty of lactose for a creamy and luxurious mouthfeel.
