2	<b>Anspach &amp; Hopday</b> <i>Southwark, London</i>		The Smoked Brown	Brown Ale	5.5	This is a modern take on a traditional Brown Ale. It's brewed using malt smoked over beechwood in Bamberg, Germany. The subtle smokiness, together with dark fruit and toffee flavours gives this a lush, dry mouthfeel and a clean finish. (V)
3	<b>Beer Shack</b> <i>Clitheroe, Lancashire</i>		The Greatest Biscuit Salesman There Ever Was	Pale Ale	5.7	Brewed especially for the festival. A hazy vanilla cream Pale Ale. Brewed in honour of the brewer's late old school friend, who made a bit of extra money at school breaktime selling custard cream biscuits out of his briefcase. Biscuit and wheat malts give the biscuit base taste and torrefied oats are added to give a big mouth feel. Lactose and vanilla add the custard flavour balanced with the addition of Nugget, Citra and Azacca hops.
4	<b>Bentley Brook</b> <i>Matlock, Derbyshire</i>		March Of The Gladiators	Golden Ale	4.3	A light Golden Ale brewed with Derbyshire grown Pale Malt and Cara, offering a subtle biscuit flavour. (V)
5	<b>Big Hand</b> <i>Wrexham, Clwyd</i>		Spectre Stout	Stout	4.5	Burnt toast and a subtle hint of liquorice feature in this smooth, dry, ultra dark easy drinking oatmeal Stout. (V)
6	<b>Big Trip</b> <i>Ancoats, Manchester</i>		The Pale with No Name	Pale Ale	4.4	A well-balanced, juicy Pale Ale that emphasizes hop character with a lighter body, making it highly drinkable. The Cryo hops add an extra level of tropical fruit notes making it a vibrant and hop-forward beer perfect for those who enjoy a burst of fruitiness but want to avoid something too heavy or boozy.
7	<b>Bini</b> <i>Leeds, West Yorkshire</i>		Cats Eyes	Pale Ale	4.2	A clean and crisp quaffable Pale Ale using Ella, Mosaic and Centennial hops. (VF)
8	<b>Blackjack</b> <i>Manchester, Gtr Manchester</i>		Hinges	Red	5	A supremely easy-drinking malted Irish Red Ale. A blend of Crystal, Chocolate and Munich malt gives a strong malt backbone, with notes of toffee and Ovaltine and a complex biscuit flavour. (V)
9	<b>Bowland</b> <i>Clitheroe, Lancashire</i>		Tatiana's Reverie	Imperial Stout	10	A deep, opaque smooth and velvety Imperial Stout. Full-bodied, rich texture giving decadent aromas of roasted coffee and dark chocolate, with a subtle undertone of vanilla sweetness from the oreo biscuits.
10	<b>Bowland</b> <i>Clitheroe, Lancashire</i>		Stag's Roar	ESB	5	A deep amber malty beer, with hints of toffee, caramel and biscuit, followed by a gentle bitterness from the classic English hops. Rich, smooth and complex and a great example of this classic British style of beer.
11	<b>Brew 61</b> <i>Bromsgrove, Worcestershire</i>		Spring Meadow	Session IPA	4.3	A golden English Pale Ale, giving a clean low to moderate bitterness, fruity hop sweetness and a slight peppery taste. GF

12	<b>Burnt Mill</b> <i>Ipswich, Suffolk</i>		<b>Beyond The Firs</b>	Pale Ale	4.8	Hopped in the whirlpool with Citra and Centennial. Dry-hopped with Citra, Centennial, Idaho 7 and Simco, giving tangerine and grapefruit aromas with a subtle piney bitterness. <b>(GF)(V)</b>
13	<b>Clearwater</b> <i>Bideford, Devon</i>		<b>Revival</b>	Copper Ale	4.6	Great depth of flavour and a great feel on the finish from late and dry hopping with Centennial hops. <b>(VF)</b>
14	<b>Crooked River</b> <i>Cockermouth, Cumbria</i>		<b>Golden Ale</b>	Golden Ale	4.2	A refreshing Golden Ale made from Maris Otter and Dark Munich malt. Biscuity malt flavour paired with First Gold and Amarillo hops give a lovely orange marmalade and peach taste.
15	<b>Fell</b> <i>Grange-over-Sands, Cumbria</i>		<b>Drinking Beer No. 11</b>	Rotbier	4.5	A collaboration with Café Beermoth in Manchester. This is a smooth, lightly hopped rich Red Lager or “rotbier”, packed with German dark malt to give it deep caramel notes.
16	<b>Fierce</b> <i>Aberdeen, Aberdeenshire</i>		<b>Very Mild Moose</b>	Dark Mild	4.6	This evokes freshly-brewed coffee, toasted nuts, redcurrant and roasty malt, with subtle hints of chocolate and vanilla. <b>(VF)</b>
17	<b>Fierce</b> <i>Aberdeen, Aberdeenshire</i>		<b>IPA</b>	IPA	5	A modern IPA with aromas of orange, pine and caramel. Bursting with flavours of juicy nectarine and bittersweet citrus zest. <b>(GF) (VF)</b>
18	<b>Full Circle</b> <i>Newcastle, Tyne &amp; Wear</i>		<b>Golden Ale</b>	Golden Ale	3.8	Lightly-hopped with Cashmere providing subtle citrus notes and a light effervescence with a smooth bitterness. <b>(GF) (V)</b>
19	<b>Fyne Ales</b> <i>Cairndow, Argyle &amp; Bute</i>		<b>Jarl</b>	Blonde Ale	3.8	The epitome of a modern classic easy-drinking session ale. Full of balanced grapefruit and lemon flavours with a refreshing finish highlighting Citra hops.
20	<b>Green Duck</b> <i>Stourbridge, West Midlands</i>		<b>Big Red Machine</b>	Red IPA	5.2	A deep red hue with buckets of orange zest flavours from Bravo & Amarillo hops.
21	<b>Hafod</b> <i>Mold, Flintshire</i>		<b>London Pale</b>	Pale Ale	4.1	This uses a trio of British hops to give gentle fruit and spice notes . It uses Belgian yeast rather than the traditional English ale yeast, which adds distinctive fruity, banana and clove aromas to the finished beer.
22	<b>Hammerton</b> <i>Islington, London</i>		<b>N7</b>	IPA	5.2	A refreshing IPA brewed with six different hops from the US and New Zealand giving a complex citrus aroma. The subtle sweet malt flavour balances the fresh bitterness. <b>(GF)</b>
23	<b>Handsome</b> <i>Kendal, Cumbria</i>		<b>Top Knot</b>	Golden Ale	3.7	This is a well-groomed golden session Bitter. Crystal hops, English ale malt and a specially selected yeast have been mashed together to give a hint of citrus and a good hop and malt balance that makes way for a dry finish. <b>(GF) (VF)</b>
24	<b>Hopworks</b> <i>Preston, Lancashire</i>		<b>Pêche Mode</b>	Saison	4.6	Especially casked for the festival. A refreshingly dry and rustic farmhouse-style ale, infused with delicate natural peach for a subtle fruit twist. A peppery spice, gentle clove, and earthy yeast funk is balanced by a light, juicy stone fruit sweetness, finishing tart and clean.
25	<b>Iron Pier</b> <i>Gravesend, Kent</i>		<b>Wealdway IPA</b>	IPA	4.5	This IPA uses Citra and Simcoe hops, which gives a tropical citrus and piney hop character. <b>(VF)</b>

26	<b>JW Lees x Bowland</b> <i>Middleton, Manchester &amp; Clitheroe, Lancashire</i>		<b>Forest Trail</b>	<b>Pale Ale</b>	<b>3.8</b>	A brewery collaboration, using experimental hops alongside Magnum and Citra. A refreshing session Pale Ale bursting with aromas of blackberries and ripe stone fruit, delivering balanced bitterness with a crisp light-bodied clean finish.
27	<b>Kerr's Brewery</b> <i>Pathhead, Midlothian</i>		<b>Fala</b>	<b>Golden Ale</b>	<b>3.7</b>	Full-bodied from the addition of oats, rye and fruity Slovenian Eagle hops. Floral, peach, citrus and rhubarb-like aromas. Thirst quenching and flavoursome. <b>(V)</b>
28	<b>Lancaster</b> <i>Lancaster, Lancashire</i>		<b>Mosaic</b>	<b>Blonde</b>	<b>4.2</b>	A delicious easy-drinking Blonde Ale, hopped with Mosaic leading to a crisp finish.
29	<b>Lost Pier</b> <i>Burgess Hill, West Sussex</i>		<b>Oatmeal Stout</b>	<b>Stout</b>	<b>5</b>	Silky smooth with a complex malt base. Merlot wine and vanilla are added to give background notes of plum and red berries. <b>(VF)</b>
30	<b>Moorhouses</b> <i>Burnley, Lancashire</i>		<b>Sun Worshipper</b>	<b>Pale Ale</b>	<b>4.0</b>	Extra pale session ale, dry hopped with Nelson Sauvignon and T45 Olicana hops to give summer aromas of gooseberries, mango and passionfruit.
31	<b>Nethergate</b> <i>Sudbury, Suffolk</i>		<b>Old Growler</b>	<b>Porter</b>	<b>5</b>	Multi-award winning Porter using Sovereign and Challenger hops. Smooth with a smokey malt aroma and notes of coffee, chocolate, treacle, fruit and licorice. <b>(V)</b>
32	<b>Otherworld</b> <i>Dalkieth, Midlothian</i>		<b>Nyx Historic Porter</b>	<b>Porter</b>	<b>5.1</b>	A historic Porter, once common in the 19th Century. Roasty, dark and rich. Full-bodied using Chevalier malt and high hopping rates characteristic of the time. <b>(V)</b>
33	<b>Patron's Tap</b> <i>Guide, Blackburn</i>		<b>First Draft</b>	<b>Copper Ale</b>	<b>4.3</b>	A creamy, moderately sweet caramel base is supplemented with a very traditional English hoppy character and restrained bitterness. A strong head continues until the final gulps of what is a very sessionable Copper Ale.
34	<b>Queer Brewing</b> <i>Walthamstow, London</i>		<b>Lay Down My Bones</b>	<b>American Brown Ale</b>	<b>4.8</b>	Classic American Brown Ale using Amarillo and Willamette hops. Fruitcake aroma with notes of raisins, chocolate and caramel. <b>(V)</b>
35	<b>Ridge</b> <i>Longridge, Lancashire</i>		<b>Well, Well, Well</b>	<b>West Coast IPA</b>	<b>5</b>	Distinct pine and dank characteristics from Columbus and Chinook hops. Crystal malt balances the bitter and resinous kettle additions. Clean crisp finish and dry hopped with Cascade to accentuate the citrus notes.
36	<b>Rudgate</b> <i>Tockwith, North Yorkshire</i>		<b>Ruby Mild</b>	<b>Mild</b>	<b>4.4</b>	Multi-award winning nutty, rich and smooth Ruby Ale with notes of caramel and chocolate.
37	<b>Salopian</b> <i>Hadnall, Shropshire</i>		<b>Dark Shadow</b>	<b>Stout</b>	<b>4.4</b>	An American style Stout. Deep, dark and richly black, a powerhouse of a stout with concentrated flavours of coffee and molasses, infused with clean fruity hops and balanced by a deep bitterness.
38	<b>Serious</b> <i>Rochdale, Gtr Manchester</i>		<b>Wit</b>	<b>Witbier</b>	<b>4</b>	An old favourite not since seen 2018 and especially rebrewed for this festival. A traditional hazy Wheat Beer with orange and coriander seed.
39	<b>Shakespeare</b> <i>Stretton on Fosse, Warwickshire</i>		<b>Bard's Best</b>	<b>Golden</b>	<b>4.2</b>	Deep gold, vibrant and hoppy with hints of citrus.

40	<b>Silent Mill</b> <i>Lytham, Lancashire</i>		River's End	Blonde Ale	4.6	A light and refreshing ale. A touch of sweetness comes from the Caramunich malt, balanced with complexity from the Noble and west coast hops. Made especially for Clitheroe Beer festival, brewed at the River Ribble's End and sent to the Ribble Valley.
41	<b>Squawk x Beer Shack</b> <i>Burnley, Lancashire &amp; Clitheroe, Lancashire</i>		Quaff The Raven	Black IPA	5.5	A brewery collaboration brewed especially for the festival. A 5.5% Black IPA that strikes a nice balance between the roasted malts typically found in darker beers and the bright, hoppy bitterness of an IPA.
42	<b>Stancil</b> <i>Sheffield, South Yorkshire</i>		Barnsley Bitter	Bitter	3.8	A legendary copper coloured ale made using the original Oakwell Brewery recipe. Nutty and slightly sweet with a smooth bitter finish.
43	<b>Stewart</b> <i>Loanhead, Midlothian</i>		Stewart's 80/-	Scottish Heavy	4.4	Full-bodied auburn classic Scottish Heavy with a malt and dried fruit aroma. Smooth and creamy.
44	<b>Strangers</b> <i>Linlithgow, West Lothian</i>		Bramble Pie	Saison	4.8	A balanced Saison, with a malty backbone and plenty of Scottish blackberries. A beautiful blackberry aroma and flavour, ginger and cinnamon add a little touch of warming spice, with lactose giving a hint of creamy sweetness. This beer is a gorgeous light purple colour. <b>(GF)</b>
