7	<b>Brehon Brewhouse</b> <i>Dunelty, Co. Monaghan, Ireland</i>		<b>Ulster Black Oatmeal Stout</b>	<b>Stout</b>	5	A toasted malt aroma with flavours of dark chocolate and coffee. Full-bodied and full of flavour.
8	<b>Brewsters</b> <i>Grantham, Lincolnshire</i>		<b>Decadence</b>	<b>Golden Ale</b>	4.4	Listed as one of Roger Protz's 300 Beers to Try Before You Die. A Golden Ale with a hint of malt sweetness from Caramalt with passion fruit and grapefruit aromas. Nelson Sauvin hops give a complex zesty hop palate with a fresh herby finish.

Dark, with a creamy head, this Cascadian Dark Ale uses Krush and Mosaic hops, which gives flavours of citrus and ripe berries leading to a very subtle bitterness. <b>(VF)</b>
11	<b>Charnwood</b> <i>Loughborough, Leicestershire</i>		<b>Salvation</b>	<b>Golden Ale</b>	3.8	A light refreshing golden beer, with tropical fruit, citrus and floral flavours from the Cascade and Amarillo hops.
